- Review the Final 2018 rule for the Quality Payment Program (QPP).

- Expanded options introduced for provider participation in Advanced APMs include bonus points for small practices and for treatment complex patients.
- New bonus points for 15 or fewer clinician groups, including an exclusion for individual MIPS-eligible clinicians or groups with less than or equal to \$90K in Part B allowed charges, or less than or equal to 200 Part B beneficiaries.
- New option designed to help clinicians and small, rural practices take on shared responsibility for value-based payments.
- Virtual groups may also qualify for incentive points under the Quality performance category.
- Learn the role of patient engagement and technology for reimbursement under MACRA
- Take an interactive tour on the Physician Compare web site to view performance measures.
- Practices impacted by the recent hurricanes may qualify for a new hardship exemption.
- Practices currently using the Certified Electronic Health Record Technology (CEHRT) can continue in year two, but only 2015 CEHRT practices will receive the bonus.
